Ask your child to think of a friend or relative. They can then complete the **My Friend and I Worksheet** and talk about the similarities and differences.

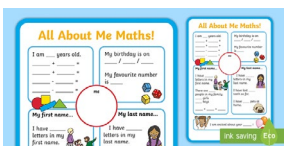
Maths



Practise **Addition to 10**. Help your child to count the groups and find the total. Can they write the numbers?



Practise number and colour recognition with the **Colour by Number**. Help your child to read the colour words and numbers to 10.



Focus on maths that's relevant to your child with the **All About Me Maths Worksheet**. Fill in numbers about your child's age, family members, letters in their name and more.

Extra Activities



Complete an **All About Me Activity Booklet**.



Make **Fun Pizza Faces** together. Let your child help to weigh and mix the ingredients. Then, they can design their own face!

- Try some of the **Home Learning Challenges**.
- Make a paper plate self-portrait.
- Look at photos of your child and another person. What is the same? What is different?
- Make an 'All About Me' collage using old newspapers, magazines and catalogues to show your child's favourite food, animal, colour, etc.
- Try learning some sign language. Start with some simple BSL signs, such as 'hello', 'food' and 'thanks'.
- Ask your child their favourite colour. How many things can they find, say or draw that are the same colour?
