<p><b>Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)</b></p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Practise telling the time. <a href="https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/116/telling_the_time">https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/116/telling_the_time</a> My Maths (Username: Benedict/ Password: angle)</li> <li>● Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything they know about <b>Shape</b>. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be.</li> <li>● Practise counting forwards and backwards from any given number in 5s.</li> <li>● Practise writing down your times table facts for the x8 and x9 times tables.</li> </ul>	<p>Remember to check 'Purple Mash' daily to see the tasks Mrs Thomas has set for you.</p>
<p><b>Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)</b></p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Read one of the chapter books we have given to you. Keep a journal as you are reading. Make notes and jot down any new vocabulary.</li> <li>● You could share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day.</li> <li>● Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.</li> <li>● Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world.</li> <li>● Get your child to read a book on Oxford Owl, discuss what your child enjoyed about the book.</li> <li>● Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?</li> </ul>	<p>Remember to check 'Purple Mash' daily to see the tasks Miss Marlow has set for you.</p>
<p><b>Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)</b></p>
