<p>Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Practise telling the time. https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/116/telling_the_time My Maths (Username: Benedict/ Password: angle) ● Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything they know about Time. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be. ● Practise counting forwards and backwards from any given number in 3s. ● Practise writing down your times table facts for the x11 and x12 times tables. 	<p>Remember to check 'Purple Mash' daily to see the tasks Mrs Thomas has set for you.</p>
<p>Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Read one of the chapter books we have given to you. Keep a journal as you are reading. Make notes and jot down any new vocabulary. ● You could share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day. ● Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation. ● Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world. ● Get your child to read a book on Oxford Owl, discuss what your child enjoyed about the book. ● Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? <p>Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)</p>
